WHAT IS CHILD WELFARE?

Child Welfare in Canada refers to a system of children's aid societies established by provincial and territorial governments, at times in partnership with private organizations, to provide services that supplement or substitute for parental care and supervision.¹

The field of Child Welfare is focused on improving the health, well-being, education and safety of children and youth. Children's aid societies work with service partners and the community to ensure the safety, well-being and stability of children and youth.²

HOW DOES THE CHILDREN'S AID FOUNDATION HELP OUR MOST VULNERABLE CHILDREN AND YOUTH?

The children and youth we serve are in desperate need of consistent and focussed support in all areas of their lives if they are to overcome the many obstacles they face.

The Children's Aid Foundation is Canada's only national charity with the capacity to strategically raise funds in order to fund and deliver high-impact programs and services for uniquely vulnerable kids all across our country.

WORKING WITH CHILD WELFARE AGENCIES ACROSS CANADA, WE...

- » Fund and oversee the nation's most innovative programs and services for neglected and abused children and youth
- » Bridge the gap between government support and what these young people need to heal and become healthy, successful adults
- » Help vulnerable kids overcome the obstacles that hold them back by providing ongoing support to those who need it most

UNDERSTANDING CANADA'S CHILD WELFARE LANDSCAPE AND THE CHILDREN WE SERVE

The Children's Aid Foundation serves kids and youth at all levels of involvement with Canada's child welfare agencies, from infancy to approximately age 26. Of the children and youth we serve:

76,000 LIVE IN FOSTER AND GROUP HOMES

That represents 1% of the nation's child population who are living in foster care, group homes, or with family members in formal kinship care arrangements as a result of the abuse or neglect they have suffered at the hands of their caregivers.¹

250,000 ARE AT RISK IN THE COMMUNITY

These are children who are receiving support and services from child protection agencies while living with their families in the community.² These children are often at risk of experiencing abuse, neglect and extreme poverty.

2,300 ARE TRANSITIONING OUT OF CARE

These young people "age out" of the child welfare system every year upon turning 18 or 19 and are forced to face the overwhelming task of establishing their independence with little to no financial or emotional support.³

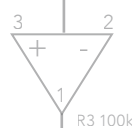
1. Health and Well-Being: Access to mental and physical health supports

Jason, John and Lindsay[†] - ages 8, 7 and 1 were brought into care after their parent was found to be using drugs and neglecting the children. Moving from a biological family to foster or kinship care is a traumatic experience for any child and, depending on the situation, children sometimes arrive with nothing but the clothes on their back. The few possessions they may arrive with are often packed in garbage bags.

Through the support of the Ted and Loretta Rogers Foster Care Transition Program, the siblings were provided comfort kits - backpacks filled with items and supplies that aid in their care, well-being, and sense of security as they faced one of the most overwhelming experiences of their lives. The children immediately bonded with their teddy bears, feeling a strong sense of comfort having these new friends to love and hug. They were able to choose an additional item and they decided on an e-tablet to share, which they will use to help with homework and for a bit of extra fun during play time.

The children were very excited to have their own possessions, and they now feel a sense of belonging and stability that comes with knowing that people care for them.

Our work would simply not be possible without the support of our generous donors, whose dedication allows us to continue bringing positive change to the lives of Canada's most vulnerable children and youth.

We are extremely grateful for our strong group of committed corporations, individuals, foundations and community donors. We also wish to thank those donors who have chosen to remain anonymous.

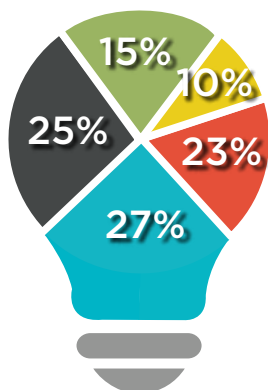

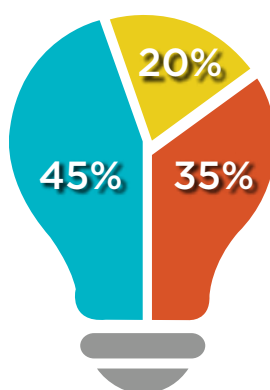

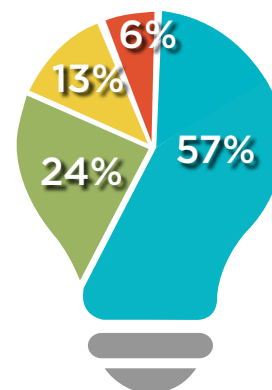
